PASADENA, CALIFORNIA— Nearly 150 local leaders from the fields of education, government, business and the non- profit world assembled on November 12 at Caltech's Athenaeum to celebrate the tenth anniversary of Leadership Pasadena and pay tribute to the 24 individuals who helped found the organization.
