**LEADERSHIP PASADENA APPOINTS BARBARA CAVALIER
AS PROGRAM FACILITATOR**



Leadership Pasadena announces the selection of Barbara Cavalier, principal of Cavalier & Associates in Monrovia, as the new facilitator of the organization's leadership training program.

She will step into the role formerly held by Kathleen Terry, who guided the original program model to measurable successes over her seven-year tenure. A search

committee established by the Leadership Pasadena board of directors determined that Cavalier's experience with innovative training programs, coaching, change management and building growth-fostering relationships were deciding factors in their choice.

A founder of a global consulting services firm, Cavalier is the co-producer and facilitator of a women's leadership conference that is moving into its sixth year in New Mexico. She holds a doctorate degree in human and organizational systems and has twice received the Working Women's Association of Los Angeles *Medal of Excellence* for outstanding contribution to business. She formerly served as director of sales development at the Avery Dennison Corporation in Pasadena.

"Leadership Pasadena and its program are vital to the community because leaders must know what is happening behind the scenes, what the community is facing and how we are all connected," she said. "It's about creating solutions and fostering long-term growth."

Since 1999 Leadership Pasadena has trained and strengthened more than 160 graduates who are bringing about positive change in the community through their skills and services.
